



MY SCRIPTURAL PRAYERS



Scriptural Prayers are the prayers for believers that are recorded in the Bible, particularly in the New Testament. They are so **POWERFUL** and so **POTENT** — there's no weakness or fear in any of these prayers! **They are stacked, loaded, and full of victory!** Just resting your eyes on these prayers is going to put something good on the inside of you.

Scriptural prayers are SPIRIT-ANOINTED PRAYERS. They can serve as a foundation for your prayer life. Everytime you pray, you can use them as a basis or a starting point. From there, the Holy Spirit can lead you to pray for other things, however He chooses to lead you to pray.

Praying according to the scriptures GUARANTEES RESULTS! The Bible says that if we pray according to God's Word, He hears us and if we know that God has heard our prayers, we know that we have what we have asked of Him. (1 Jn. 5:14,15) This is the confidence we can have everytime we pray these prayers!

Here are the Scriptural Prayers written in a personalized manner (in first person). Use and pray them over your life as often as you desire! You may also pray them over other people by simply replacing the highlighted texts with the name of the person you want to pray for:



The Ephesians 1 Prayer (Eph. 1:16–23)

I do not cease to give thanks, making mention of **MYSELF** in this prayer: that You, the God of my Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give to **ME** the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of You, the eyes of **MY** understanding being enlightened; that **I** may know what is the hope of Your calling, what are the riches of the glory of Your inheritance in the saints, and what is the exceeding greatness of Your power toward **ME** who believes, according to the working of Your mighty power which You worked in Christ when You raised Him from the dead and seated Him at Your right hand in the heavenly places, far above all principality and power and might and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this age but also in that which is to come.

And You put all things under Jesus' feet, and gave Him to be head over all things to the church, which is His body, the fullness of Him who fills all in all. Amen.



The Ephesians 3 Prayer (Eph. 3:14-20)

I bow my knees to You, the Father of my Lord Jesus Christ, from whom the whole family in heaven and earth is named, and I ask that You would grant **ME**, according to the riches of Your glory, to be strengthened with might through Your Spirit in **MY** inner man, that Christ may dwell in **MY** heart through faith; that **I**, being rooted and grounded in love, may be able to comprehend with all the saints what is the width and length and depth and height — to know the love of Christ which passes knowledge; that **I** may be filled with all Your fullness. Now to You who are able to do exceedingly abundantly above all that **I** ask or think, according to the power that works in **ME**, to You be glory in the church by Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen.



The Philippians 1 Prayer (Phil. 1:9-11; AMPC)

And this I pray: that **MY** love may abound yet more and more and extend to its fullest development in knowledge and all keen insight [that **MY** love may display itself in greater depth of acquaintance and more comprehensive discernment], so that **I** may surely learn to sense what is vital, and approve and prize what is excellent and of real value [recognizing the highest and the best, and distinguishing the moral differences], and that **I** may be untainted and pure and unerring and blameless [so that with a heart sincere and certain and unsullied, **I** may approach] the day of Christ [not stumbling nor causing others to stumble].

I ask that **I** may abound in and be filled with the fruits of righteousness (of right standing with You and right doing) which come through Jesus Christ (the Anointed One), to Your honor and praise [that Your glory may be both manifested and recognized]. Amen.



The Colossians Prayer (Col. 1:9-14)

I do not cease to pray for **MYSELF**, and to ask that **I** may be filled with the knowledge of Your will in all wisdom and spiritual understanding; that **I** may walk worthy of You, Lord, fully pleasing You, being fruitful in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of You; strengthened with all might, according to Your glorious power, for all patience and longsuffering with joy; giving thanks to You, Father, who have qualified **ME** to be a partaker of the inheritance of the saints in the light. You have delivered **ME** from the power of darkness and conveyed **ME** into the kingdom of the Son of Your love, in whom **I** have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins. Amen.
